### What's Happening in Parks and Recreation?


Chair: Anita Pieri, members Mary Maxion, Pat Strus. Movie nights are very successful, so buying our own equipment will allow us to have more movie nights, especially in the summer. Final plans for "Skate Park" at Knight Park, paid for by "Station Square", are being reviewed. We will present them for public comment, hopefully by the November 4 committee meeting. We await county approval for the "Green Building and Trail" at Knight Park, paid for by County Green Fields/Green Towns Program and a Borough match. The Green Building is a multi purpose, environmentally friendly community structure. Connected to it is a trail that will link the park to the County Green Ribbon Trail. The EAC (Environmental Advisory Committee) has applied for a grant that would add a riparian buffer along the Stuart Farm Creek. This will beautify and help some with flooding in low lying areas.

### News from the Water Department

The Department will begin its \$650,000 rehabilitation of the Loch Alsh Reservoir during summer/fall of 2010. A \$520,000 PA grant was awarded to the Water Department for structural remediation of the dam. The Whitemarsh Pumping Station, near Hope Lodge, has returned to service. Broad Axe Water Tank has been inspected and painted. The Houston Road Tank is scheduled for painting in 2010. Also the sewer department was awarded a \$167,000 grant for sanitary sewer repair.

### Parking in Ambler

Parking is free Sundays, from noon to 2pm weekdays as well as 6pm to 8am all days. There will be free parking in December to help holiday shopping!

#### Storm Water - Good Housekeeping

Even a light rain washes dirt, oil and other surface pollutants into our streams. This is great for keeping the street clean but is a major problem for the Borough's creeks. All the dirt, oil, lawn fertilizer, road salt, leaves, grass clipping, pet waste, etc. that washes away with even a light rain ends up as pollution in the Wissahickon. "Good housekeeping" can help minimize the amount of pollution that enters the Borough's creeks and streams. The Borough helps by regularly sweeping streets, cleaning leaves and trash from storm inlets, providing trash cans for proper waste disposal throughout town, keeping up with vehicle and equipment maintenance and by maintaining the Borough parks. Everyone in Ambler is responsible for keeping our water clean. There are many simple "housekeeping" items property and business owners can do to help with this effort. Some of these include the following:

- keeping properties clean,
- properly storing motor oil, paint, and household chemicals and cleaners.
- preventing oil, paint, chemicals, soap and wash water from entering the storm drains,
- limiting use of fertilizers,
- cleaning up after pets,
- installing rain barrels to collect roof runoff; dispose of yard waste properly.

With cooperation and effort from everyone we can help keep Ambler's water clean. If you would like more information, Borough Staff and the Ambler Environmental Advisory Council (EAC) are great resources. The Borough website is a valuable resource (www.ambler.pa.us). A link to additional information regarding the Municipal Storm Water Management Program can be found under the "Other Links" section of the website. All Ambler residents and businesses are encouraged to review this information and to help in Borough efforts to keep our water clean. ### Remember, You Must Recycle at Curbside

Metal: Aluminum, Steel and Tin Cans

Plastic: Detergent, Milk and #1 and 2 Containers.

Glass: Bottles and Jars

Paper: Cereal Boxes, Newspapers, Magazines,

Telephone Books, Mixed Paper, Junk Mail.

Cardboard: Clean, flattened 2'x2' pieces, tied in a bundle.

### \*Yard Waste Pickup to be Year Round in 2010\*

For your convenience yard waste pickup will now be available year round. A new Leaf Waste Ordinance #1042 prohibits placing leaf waste in with regular trash. Leaf and Yard Waste materials will be picked up on the following TUESDAYS in 2010: January

- 12, February 9, March 9, April 20 and 27, May 4, June 8, July 13, August 10, September
- 14, October 12, November 16, 23 & 30, December
- 7. Separating yard waste materials for pickup will help reduce volume weight and contain costs of regular garbage pickup. Yard waste materials must continue to be placed in unlined cans or brown paper Recycle Bags. Plastic bags are **prohibited**. All uncollected materials must be stored on your property until scheduled pickup or dropped off at Barnside Farm Compost Facility, 430 Dieber Rd, Schwenksville (610-287-8880 or 610-888-7719.)
