#### Code Enforcement Hotline: (215) 646-1000 Ext. 135

You may now report issues and problems 24 hours-a-day by leaving a message at (215) 646-1000 Ext. 135 on the Code Enforcement Hotline. Issues such as overcrowded housing, deteriorating properties, unsafe conditions, excessive trash & debris can be reported anonymously. A complaint form then will be processed and the complaint will be followed and documented to conclusion by Ron Myers Sr., Code Enforcement Officer. If you request a call back, you will be updated on the status of the complaint.

#### Building Permits Are a Must

Borough Code mandates a building permit be obtained when "Any owner or authorized agent who intends to construct, enlarge, alter, repair, move, demolish or change the occupancy of a building or structure, or to erect, install, enlarge, alter, repair, remove, convert or replace any electrical, gas, mechanical or plumbing system, the installation of which is regulated by this code, or to cause any such work to be done, shall first make application to the building official and obtain the required permit." Building permits may be obtained at the receptionist's desk at Borough Hall (M-F 8:00am-4:30 pm). Also, water from concrete jobs must not be discharged into gutters and storm drains.

#### Police Department

Through the efforts of Representative Allyson Schwartz, the Borough has received a federal grant in the amount of \$127,000 for modern technology upgrades for our Police Department.

Parking meters are being enforced Monday-Friday from 8am-6pm. Noon-2pm is free for lunch. Saturday 8am-6pm meters are enforced. Sundays and Holidays are free.

# Ambler's Stormwater Management Program

10 Things You Can Do to Prevent Stormwater Runoff Pollution

Below are 10 simple things the typical home owner and/or business owner can do to help reduce pollutants in rain water carried to Ambler's streams and creeks. By making an effort to keep our rain water clean you are helping the Borough and the environment.

- Use fertilizers very sparingly.
- ◆ Sweep up driveways and sidewalks: dispose debris properly. Do not sweep into street gutters.
- Never dump anything down storm drains.
- ♦ Vegetate bare spots in your yard.
- ◆ Compost your yard waste.
  ◆ Avoid pesticides; learn about Integrated Pest Management (IPM).
- Direct downspouts away from paved surfaces.
- ◆ Take your car to the car wash instead of washing it in the driveway.
- Check car for leaks, and recycle motor oil.
- ◆ Pick up after your pet, even in your own yard.

Bring Automotive Products like motor oil; Household Products like cleaners, fluorescent tubes; Paint Products like oil based paints, thinner; Miscellaneous like pool chemicals, dyes, computer equipment, cell phones, cameras, copiers, fax machines, scanners, mercury devices, any rechargeable power tools and/ or batteries. Keep liquid items with labels intact; lids tight. Secure items in boxes for transport, separating components that may react with each other. Do not leave materials in hot areas. Do not smoke around materials. Provide ventilation.

# Borough Recycling

To receive another or a replacement recycling bin call the Borough and ask when you can pick one up. 215-646-1000. Recycle to keep trash costs low. Recycling saves a large percent of the energy used to make



bottles, cans and paper. Recycle each Wednesday at curbside.

## Best Tree Care Practices

Choose the right tree for the right place. Check wires overhead. Call PAOneCall (p. 4) and get results before digging. Water new trees thoroughly once a week if no rain. Mulch to retain moisture, forming a donut shape of 2-4" depth, not a dome. Consult a fully insured certified arborist to prune. Arborists know expert ways to remove dead, diseased or rubbing branches, so the branch cut will seal well. They avoid a round off or "topping", which tends to damage the tree and cost more in the long term. Avoid paving on or compacting roots.
