Notes from the Borough Manager Mary Aversa

1) Bottom Dollar Food Market, Ambler Beverage to Open

The Borough Manager is pleased to announce that *Bottom Dollar* plans to build and operate a Bottom Dollar food market in Ambler, at the site of the former Knopf Chevy dealer. Final site plans currently are under review by the Planning Commission. Also, please note that *Ambler Beverage* is renovating the old beer distributorship on Butler Avenue and will open a walk-in beer store later in the year. Once construction at these two sites is complete the Borough plans to repave Butler Avenue. Also in the works is the reconstruction and resurfacing of the Lindenwold Parking Lot located behind Ambler Savings Bank.

2) Reporting Street Light and Signal Outages

The Borough appreciates the vigilant calls we receive from residents reporting street light outages. We are members of a consortium that takes care of repair of all street lights. If you notice a light out please try to obtain the pole number on the light and call the Borough with that information and street or address information specific to that light. Since each streetlight is numbered, we will be able to more rapidly relay this information to the consortium to schedule a repair. 3) Know Your Utility Employee

Should a utility employee come to your door, please observe the following precautions before allowing anyone to enter your residence: (1) Ask to see identification before allowing anyone in; (2) Call the utility company to verify work being done and to verify the identity of the employee if you have any doubts; (3) Look for clearly marked utility vehicles; (4) Report any suspicious activity to the police and the proper utility company.

4) Do Not Solicit List

Occasionally businesses come to the Borough to conduct door-to-door solicitations. They are required to obtain a Day Permit from Code Enforcement to register their sales force and vehicles. If you do not want to be solicited you may contact the Borough to be placed on a 'Do Not Solicit' list. The vendor will be given a list of households that are not to be contacted.

5) Water Line Protection Plan

Ambler Borough's lateral water line protection plan offers open enrollment for residential water customers. The plan protects you should anything happen to your water service line from the point at which it crosses the outer vertical wall of the residence to the point at which it reaches the property boundary. In the event of a water quality emergency we need to get in touch with our customers. We do this through SWIFTREACH, our Public Phone Dial Notification System. 10 Things You Can Do to Prevent Stormwater Runoff Pollution By Jim Dougherty P.E., Gilmore & Associates, Inc., Borough Engineers

Ambler Borough, as the owner of the storm sewer system within the Borough, is required by Federal and State Law to reduce and eliminate pollution from stormwater runoff collected by the storm sewer and discharges to the local creeks and streams. These requirements affect all property owners, business owners, and residents within Ambler. Ten things you can do to help prevent stormwater pollution are:

Use fertilizers sparingly

Sweep driveways and sidewalks

Clean gutters and downspouts

Never dump anything down storm drains or in streams

Vegetate bare spots in your yard

Compost your yard waste

Use least toxic pesticides, follow labels, and learn how to prevent pest problems

Direct downspouts away from paved surfaces; consider a rain garden to capture runoff

- Take your car to the car wash instead of washing it in the driveway
- Check your car for leaks and recycle your motor oil

Pick up after your pet

Recycle at Curbside in rollcarts: Newspapers, inserts and junk mail, magazines, catalogues, envelopes, paperback books, phone books, cardboard, *clean* pizza boxes, paper, (includes cereal, cake and cracker boxes) paper egg cartons, paper bags, aluminum cans, *clean* foil, tin and *empty* aerosol cans, empty glass jars and bottles, and plastic *containers labeled* 1-7. NO garbage, plastic bags, food contaminated waste, polystyrene cups, plates, egg cartons or ice cream containers, motor oil, hazardous chemical containers, plastic toys, sporting goods, electronics, batteries, compact discs, DVDs, light bulbs, hangers nor yard waste.

Recycling

It has been over a year since Ambler Borough began single stream recycling. The program is overwhelmingly successful and the Borough certainly is a much neater place on Wednesday mornings!

We'd like to take this opportunity to introduce you to Montgomery County's website

www.montgomerycountyrecycles.com . The County coordinates collection sites for 1) household hazardous waste (HHW),

 electronics that are not to be placed out with regular refuse or recycling materials and
 old tires. Did you know, for example, that oil-based paints are considered HHW, but that

latex paints are not, and may be put out with regular refuse with the lid removed and only after the paint in the container is fully dried out? For more information call the Montgomery County Recycling Hotline at 610-278-3618.

PLEASE NOTE THAT HHW AND ELECTRONICS COLLECTIONS ARE NOW **SEPARATE EVENTS** UNLIKE EARLIER YEARS.
