

Stormwater Management: Our Fall & Winter Seasons

As we prepare for the fall and winter seasons, it is important to be mindful of our outdoor maintenance activities and how they impact the environment, especially those that affect the quality of our waterways. We can limit negative impacts by making a few simple and easy changes.

Here are some suggestions:

1. Use low nitrogen and phosphorus fertilizers in lawn and garden areas, and use these sparingly. This will reduce the amount of nutrients carried away by stormwater.
2. Keep leaves, yard waste and other debris out of the gutters. These get carried away by rain and melting snow, decay in streams and impact water quality and wildlife. Gutter guards in your downspouts are preferred and leaf removal from the street is encouraged to help the Borough.
3. Use salt and deicers only when and where appropriate, and apply the least amount necessary to keep surfaces safe. Deicers are ineffective when greater than 3-inches of snow has accumulated. Store in a dry, covered area to prevent runoff and sweep up excess de-icing materials if a storm does not occur.
4. Clean up after your pet year round during walks, as well as in your own back yard, as animal waste contributes to stormwater contamination.
5. Consider planting native trees and shrubs on your property, they are best suited for our climate, conserve water and require less fertilizer/pesticide applications. Many are available at local garden centers. Autumn is the perfect time for planting; the cool weather gives new plants a chance to establish their root system before the ground freezes.

Recycling News

Plastic Recycling Facts: Enough plastic is produced in the United States each year to shrink wrap Texas. Enough plastic bottles are thrown away in the U.S. each year to circle the Earth four times. For each ton of plastic recycled we save the equivalent of...

- The energy used by 2 people in 1 year.
- The amount of water used by 1 person over two months.
- 2,000 pounds of oil.

Paper Recycling Facts: Recycling one ton of paper would ...

- Save enough energy to power the average American home for 6 months.
- Save 7,000 gallons of water.
- Save 3.3 cubic yards of landfill space.
- Reduce greenhouse gas emissions by one metric ton of carbon equivalent (MTCE).
- Save 17 mature trees.
- Save 2 barrels of oil.
- Save 4,000 kilowatt hours of electricity.

Tips to Reduce, Reuse & Recycle

- Use products made with recycled materials.
- Use energy-efficient light bulbs and rechargeable batteries.
- Shop with cloth bags.
- Reuse plastic bags, cups, containers, etc.
- Repair items instead of throwing them away.
- Compost your food and yard waste.



Food & Beverage Cartons are Recyclable

Recycling for food and beverage cartons is now available to 60% of U.S. households, and cartons are being labeled by manufacturers with the recycling symbol. Most of the material recovery facilities or MRFs where Montgomery County material is processed, recover cartons for recycling. Local participating MRFs include the Borough's hauler J.P. Mascaro. Product containers that are in the carton category include: **food and beverage cartons such as milk, juice, soup, broth, etc.** We want to make sure that residents know that they should put their food and beverage cartons into their mixed recycling bins. Let's recycle more and waste less!

'Trash Talk' — Please Pick it Up!

Litter has environmental consequences. Wind and weather, traffic, and animals move litter into gutters, lawns and landscaped areas, alleyways, and parking structures. Litter near storm drains is likely to wash into local waterways, with potential for serious environmental contamination.

Where is litter coming from? The sources for roadside litter are motorists, pedestrians, improperly secured loads, overflowing containers and vehicle debris. Roadside litter items include tobacco products, paper, packaging, plastics and beverage containers. Non-roadside litter occurs at transition points such as bus stops, shopping areas, movies, train stations, rest areas, post offices & building entrances, and at storm drains, parking lots, vacant lots, loading docks, recreational areas and construction sites. Non-roadside litter types include scrap appliances, abandoned autos, vehicle debris, construction and demolition debris, scrap tires, abandoned signage and typical household trash.

Battery Solutions — The Borough's Safe Battery Disposal Program

Ambler Borough, working with the Environmental Advisory Council, is setting up an environmentally efficient battery recycling drop-off site in the **Ambler Borough Hall Lobby for residents only** to safely dispose of batteries. Batteries contain many chemicals that are unsafe for the environment and they are currently being thrown into the trash. The only public places where batteries can be taken to be recycled are the Whole Foods Stores and Abington Hospital. Best Buy no longer accepts batteries or electronics.

Battery Solutions provides a simple method compliant with EPA and US DOT standards for residents to recycle batteries. This is not just a disposal program. **Battery Solutions** is Responsible Recycling (R2:2013) and Recycling Industry Operating Standards (RIOS™) certified. **Battery Solutions** actually RECYCLES the batteries in the most environmentally and economically efficient way. This program allows for reuse of our natural resources efficiently and decreases the harmful environmental effects of batteries. It reduces the need for mining and processing of virgin materials. **Battery Solutions** provides a Confirmation of Reclamation certificate.

Batteries and handheld electronics may be dropped off during regular business hours in the **Ambler Borough Hall Lobby** and placed in the **iRecycle Container**. **Batteries must be taped on both ends to ensure safe transport. Batteries must fit easily into the Recycling Container.**

Materials Accepted at the Ambler Borough Hall Drop-off Location:

- Alkaline
- Nickel Cadmium (NiCd)
- Lithium-ion
- Mercury Batteries
- Button Cells
- Small Electronics (cell phones, iPods, tablets, power tools, etc.)
- Zinc Carbon
- Nickel Metal Hydride (NiMH)
- Lithium Primary
- Silver Oxide

Materials Not Accepted:

- **NO** Lead Acid – Non-Spillable
- **NO** automobile batteries
- **NO** UPS machine batteries
- **NO** industrial batteries
- **NO large batteries sized over 5-inches in length.**



How recycling is accomplished:

Alkaline – 100% recycled by using an alternative to High Temperature Metal Recovery (HTMR) most recyclers use. Instead, a non-thermal mechanical decomposition process is used, yielding a higher recycling efficiency rate (RER). This is better for the environment, producing virtually no emissions. It breaks an alkaline battery into three end products: steel, zinc and manganese concentrate, and paper & plastic for use in other applications.

Nickel Metal Hydride (NiMH) - Using a proprietary heat treatment, the highest quality nickel feedstock is extracted from these batteries. This nickel is desirable to the steel and alloy market and can be used in making stainless steel products.

Dog Licensing Procedures

Pennsylvania State Law mandates that all dogs 3 months of age or older must be licensed. Dog licenses are issued by Montgomery County, and not by the Borough Code Enforcement Office. Licenses may be purchased online, by mail, or over the counter at the Montgomery County Treasurer's Office, One Montgomery Plaza, 6th floor, Norristown. A dog owner is required to complete either an annual or lifetime dog license application. Lifetime licenses must be purchased through the Treasurer's Office and requires the dog to be tattooed or micro-chipped. A permanent license allows you to pay a one-time fee and your dog will be licensed for his or her entire life. If you are applying for a license that requires the dog owner be a senior citizen, age 65 or older, or a person with disability, you must provide proof of age or disability to the County Treasurer or a Montgomery County Dog License Agent. For information on licensing fees and dog licensing agents and for information on how to register a dog online, go to www.montcopa.org/1790/Dog-Licenses.



Narcan

Narcan is also known as the second chance drug and is used for diagnosis of suspected or known acute drug overdoses.

Ambler Police personnel are trained to use Narcan. The thrust for police departments to carry the opioid-reversing drug Narcan with them often centers on saving the lives of addicts who overdose. However, you do not have to be an addict – you can be a first time user and accidentally overdose. Either way, you should find a program to help you move beyond your addictions. PA One Call System 8-1-1 — 'Call Before You Dig'

To assure safe digging for your project, dial 8-1-1 before you dig. Safe digging is no accident! If you are installing a fence or deck, or digging for a mailbox post, patio or other excavation project, it is important to Know What's Below. Make a Pennsylvania One Call phone call three to ten business days before your scheduled dig. PA One Call will notify utility companies who will mark where underground lines, cables and pipelines are located with colored paint, flags or chalk. As the weather cools and we prepare for winter, there are a few things we can do to make our homes fire safe. The first would be to remember that when you change your clocks back for daylight savings, remember to change the batteries in your smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors. Remember to test your detectors every month and to replace detectors that are 10 years old.



When you're working around the house, remember to keep the area around your heater and hot water heater clear of any storage. These appliances need room to breathe and also can become very hot when running during the winter, easily igniting any nearby combustibles. When working outside, remember to check that your address number is easily seen from the street, to help us find you in case of emergency.

Lastly, during October, think about *Fire Prevention Week*. It is a great time to practice your home escape plan with your family and to inspect your home for any hazards such as frayed or overloaded extension cords.





Street Sweeping - The Sweeper will continue to operate this fall on a **modified schedule**, on the 1st and 3rd week of each month to coincide with Yard Waste pickup weeks. Sweeper will follow the same day-of-the-week schedule for your street and will operate: **Week of October 2, Week of October 16, Week of November 6, Week of November 20 and finally, Week of December 4.** Heed the street signs as 'No Parking' on specified days and hours will be enforced on these specified sweeping weeks. Sweeping resumes in April.

Tree Disposal – Holiday trees may be put out the 1st or 3rd Tuesday of January. Place trees curbside. Do not wrap trees in plastic tree bags – our hauler will not pick up bagged trees.

P.W. Hours of Operation – 7:00 a.m. – 3:30 p.m. Answering machine 215-628-9409. Contact the Borough Garage or the Borough receptionist to report a pothole, broken playground equipment or damaged signage.

Residential Trash & Recyclables Roll Carts – Please consider marking your 64-gallon trash roll cart (grey) and 64-gallon recycling roll cart (blue) with your house number/address. We do receive calls about roll carts that go missing. If you would like to purchase an additional or replacement roll cart please call the Borough receptionist. Additionally, please contact the Borough receptionist if the wheels on your roll cart pop off. The Borough will send a Public Works staffer to your property to replace the wheels (and axle if necessary) at no cost to you. Please do not toss out your roll carts – in most cases they can be repaired!

Preserving Ambler Borough Park

Ambler Borough Park is a beautiful and uniquely untouched ecosystem in a mostly urban area. The Borough would like to remind property owners abutting the park to refrain from depositing their yard waste in Borough Park. A natural ecosystem such as Borough Park can be thrown out of balance when excess materials are added. This is what happens when yard waste is dumped into a natural area. While materials from yards are natural or organic (composed of grass clippings, leaves, and trimmings from trees or shrubs), they were not produced by the system in which they are disposed. These piles can take years to decompose while smothering and killing any plants they cover. Besides being unsightly and encouraging others to dump their waste there, dumping on park property is illegal and subject to fines of up to \$1,000.00 (Chapter 16 Parks and Recreation of Borough Code). Please be advised the Borough trash service provides for two-yard waste collection days per month on the first and third Tuesday of every month. Working together we can continue to preserve the unique beauty of Borough Park for generations to come.

Property Owner Tips for Maintaining Ambler's Beauty, Walkability & Charm

Walkability is one of the many cornerstones which makes Ambler a desirable place to live, work, and play. Sidewalks exist on the majority of all streets within the Borough and those connections are a vital part to the Borough's pedestrian-oriented small-town environment. Walkable communities such as Ambler lead to both economic and natural benefits, more social interactions, and encourage physical fitness. Maintaining these resources is a community wide effort. Property owners should be mindful and take notice of the following:

- Inspect your sidewalks to make sure that any tripping hazards such as broken or raised sidewalks are repaired or replaced to avoid any possible injuries to pedestrians.
- Maintain any plants, flowers, or trees along sidewalk edges so that they do not hang low or inhibit pedestrians passing by.
- Cut or trim areas along curb lines where weeds or grass maybe become overgrown. This area maintenance is the responsibility of property owners.
- Shovel the snow off all sidewalks as soon as possible to avoid possible fines or pedestrian injuries. In addition, if there is a fire hydrant on your property be sure to clear a 3ft radius around the hydrant and a clear path to the street.

Property owners are encouraged to work with their neighbors to maintain sidewalks throughout the Borough. If you see any of the above violations feel free to contact the Ambler Borough Code Department to investigate. Working together we can all do our part to provide and maintain safe, clean, attractive, and walkable neighborhoods.

Water Line Protection Program Application

What is the Water Line Protection Program? It is a lateral water line protection plan offered by Ambler Borough to our residential customers. Why do we offer this? Because the pipe that carries water from the curb to your house is on your property and the pipe is owned by you. If a leak or break in this line occurs (this is called the ‘lateral line’), it is your responsibility – and your expense – to make the repair.

With the Water Line Protection Plan offered by the Borough of Ambler, if anything happens to your water service line from the point at which it crosses the outer vertical wall of the residence to the point at which it reaches the property boundary, we’ll take care of it.

This protection plan is offered to residential customers, specifically single family dwelling & residential properties with four or fewer units on the same water meter with 5/8” to 1” water service lines. The cost is \$100 for a one year protection plan and covers the cost to repair or replace allowing up to two repairs per year, \$3,500 per break maximum, capped at \$7,000 per year. Please be aware this Contract is held by you and not by the property. Therefore, should you sell your property, the plan is not transferred to the new property owner. Should you sell your property you may apply in writing for a pro-rated refund.

REFUSE & SOLID WASTE COLLECTION: Refuse/solid waste is to be placed in the grey roll cart provided by the Borough. Additional refuse/solid waste may be placed in cans with lids provided by the resident. Litter and debris can attract unwanted pests. Also, litter and debris can clog storm drains. Keep trash and recyclables covered. **DO NOT LITTER.**

RECYCLABLES ♻️ COLLECTION: Recyclables are to be placed in the blue roll cart provided by the Borough. All recyclables can be mixed together and placed in this cart **NO SORTING NEEDED.** Recycle newspapers, inserts & junk mail, magazines, catalogs & envelopes, paper back books & phone books, cardboard & clean pizza boxes, office & school papers (colored paper), box board (cereal, cake & cracker boxes); waxed cartons (milk, juice & soup containers), paper egg cartons, paper bags, aluminum cans & clean foil; tin & empty steel aerosol cans, empty glass jars & bottles, and all plastic containers labeled #1-#7.

DO NOT PUT THE FOLLOWING ITEMS IN THIS CART: NO garbage, NO plastic bags, NO Mirrors, NO food waste, NO polystyrene cups or plates, NO motor oil or hazardous chemical containers, NO plastic toys or sporting goods, NO electronics or batteries, NO compact discs or DVDs, NO foam egg cartons or ice cream containers, NO light bulbs, hangers or yard waste.

BULK COLLECTION: One bulk item (mattress, desk, etc.) per household is permitted per week. **No Tires, No TVs or Computers.** Call J.P. Mascaro & Sons at 1-800-432-1616 for "white" item pickup. For items containing Freon (refrigerators, etc) visit Montgomery County's website www.montgomerycountyclecyles.org or 610-278-3618 for a list of companies that will remove Freon and dispose of the appliance for a fee. At no cost to you, call PECO Smart Ideas (1-888-573-2672) for collection of working frigs & freezers (10-30 cuft). Please note, resident must be on site at time of scheduled pick-up.

YARD WASTE COLLECTION: (Christmas trees in January) Yard waste is to be stored on your property until scheduled pickup. Yard waste shall be placed in paper bags or unlined trash cans or may be bundled with twine. No plastic bags. Yard waste includes leaves, branches & branch materials, twig material, vine & hedge trimmings. No grass clippings. Residents may also bring yard waste to Barnside Farm Compost Facility, 991 Haldeman Rd, Schwenksville, contact at 610-287-8880.
