ENVIRONMENTAL CORNER



As we prepare for the warm Spring and Summer days ahead, it is important that we be mindful of not only our lawns and gardens, but of the lawns, gardens and waterways to which our stormwater drains. Each year, our environment is under attack by polluted stormwater runoff. We can reduce negative impacts by making a few simple and easy changes to our everyday routines.

Here are some suggestions:

- 1. Use low nitrogen and phosphorus fertilizers. This will reduce the amount of nutrients carried away by rain water.
- 2. Mulch grass clippings and remove excess grass clippings from your lawn and paved surfaces after mowing.
- 3. Consider installing a rain barrel to collect excess stormwater runoff and use it for future car washing or plant watering!
- 4. Clean up after your pet during walks, as well as in your own back yard. Animal waste contributes to stormwater contamination.
- **5.** When performing maintenance on your vehicle, make sure that all waste oils and fluids are safely collected and disposed of at approved locations, and be sure to address vehicle leaks promptly.

If you're inspired to do more for our environment a Rain Garden is a beautiful addition to your property that is a green, sustainable solution that is low-cost and easy to construct.

Interesting Facts About Paper Recycling

- Around 1 billion trees worth of paper are thrown away every year in the U.S.
- To produce each week's Sunday newspapers, 500,000 trees must be cut down.
- Every ton of paper recycled saves more than 3.3 cubic yards of landfill space.
- One million tons of recovered paper is enough to fill more than 14,000 railroad cars.
- Recycled paper produces 73% less air pollution than if it was made from raw materials.
- It takes 24 trees to make 1 ton of newspaper.
- An average American uses 465 trees worth of paper during their lifetime.
- Recycling half the world's paper would free 20 million acres of forest land.
- Paper plus cardboard combined make up 73% of the materials in a landfill.

Electronics Disposal Ban

The County will not hold E-Waste collection events in 2018. The Covered Device Recycling Act (CDRA) of 2010 prohibits the disposal of E-Waste as trash. Trash haulers may not pick up TVs or computers curbside. There are several options for recycling computers, monitors and TVs and CRT monitors. Ambler – A Growing Greener Grant Recipient

A Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection Growing Greener Grant in the amount of \$206,100 has been awarded to Ambler Borough. This grant will provide for: 75 rain gardens, 250 rain barrels, 250 downspout planters, steep slope restoration on Edgewood Preserve, and 2,000 linear feet of non-congruous riparian buffer restoration in the Borough of Ambler. The Ambler EAC, supported by Ambler Borough Council has been working towards improving stormwater management infrastructure in the community. In December of 2016, working with Red Tail Restoration and Land Management, the Ambler EAC reached out to many homeowners around the Rose Valley Creek and Tannery Run Creek to sign a letter of commitment to implement a stormwater management tool. Over 50 homeowners signed on, demonstrating Ambler Borough's responsibility in improving the Wissahickon Watershed. The Ambler EAC, working with Ambler Borough and the DEP will be implementing a three-year program to address and promote community involvement in Growing Ambler Greener through Clean Waters Clean Streams.

Ambler Earth Fest 2018

Ambler Borough Council's Environmental Advisory Council brings its annual Earth Fest back to Borough Hall on Saturday, April 21 from 10:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m., rain or shine. This family-friends event brings together a range of organizations whose focus is on environmental issues. There will be interactive educational and display exhibits, workshops, kids' activities and learning opportunities for people of all ages. Speakers will also give presentations about environmental issues.

A tentative list of presenters and exhibitors includes: Back to Earth Compost; Always Be Recycling for all your **electronics recycling** needs; and Stephen Hilbert from Bartlett Trees will be available to respond to questions about trees. Spotted Lanternfly Quarantine Zone

The Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture has announced that Montgomery County has been designated as an area quarantined due to Spotted Lanternfly, in a strategic effort to contain the insect's spread. The quarantine now includes areas where the insect is not yet confirmed. This invasive insect threatens to destroy agricultural commodities. The insect has the potential to impact the grape, hops and logging industries. The Spotted Lanternfly is an invasive planthopper that invades trees such as willow and tree of heaven, leaving weeping wounds and laying egg masses. Composting to Make a Difference in our Environment

What do you think of when you think about compost? Do you think old, moldy food? Smelly, messy, rotten fruits and vegetables? Composting may not sound pretty or exciting at all ...it didn't to me at first. Just a means to get rid of organic matter. In fact, most people think that throwing food waste and paper products into a landfill is harmless because it biodegrades. But did you know that when they do breakdown they become powerful contributors to greenhouse gas emissions?

"But, it's just another thing I have to do, and I won't make a difference." Wrong. Recycling and composting are easy action items that we can do right now as part of a solution.

If you're not quite sure yet, I would like to share some reasons to consider getting started, whether it's in your yard or through a composting service.

Three BIG reasons to Compost:

- 1. Composting is an effective way to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. When you compost, you lower your carbon footprint. Bonus: there will be less trash to haul to the curb.
- 2. Composting enriches soil & helps retain soil moisture. Think less watering.
- 3. Composting reduces the need for fertilizers on your lawn & garden. Gardening with less pesticides is good for Mother Earth.

Online Account Management Made Easy!

Water customers may now view and print their water bills and review account history and usage. Simply access the *eBilling Customer Portal* on the Borough website homepage and sign up!

To pay a water bill, online credit card and E-check payments are accepted. A convenience fee will be charged to customers using credit cards. Visit the Borough's homepage and click on *Pay Your Water Bill*. You may also pay your bill in person with personal check, cash or credit card. You may drop off your water payments (checks only) in the 24/7 Lock Box located on the left side of Borough Hall Poplar Street lot entrance. Payments may also be made in the Lobby during business hours (M-F 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.).



System Hydrant Flushing

Ambler Water Department will begin routine system hydrant flushing this spring. Flushing will occur Sunday evenings through Fridays. If you experience discolored water, **DO NOT OPEN THE HOT WATER SIDE OF YOUR FAUCET** – this will bring discolored water into the hot water tank. **RUN COLD WATER** only from your faucet for several minutes. Continue repeating this process until the water runs clear. If discoloration is severe, it also is suggested, if you have a water softener, that you by-pass the water softener until the situation is 'clear.' If the problem persists, contact the Water Department at 215-646-1000 Ext. 110 or 111 M-F between 8:00 a.m. & 4:30 p.m.

Annual Drinking Water Quality Reports

Every year the Ambler Borough Water Department publishes a Consumer Confidence Report which is designed to inform customers about the quality of water we deliver to you every day. CCR reports are sent out to our water customers every June and are also available on the Borough website.



Public Notification for Water Issues

In the event of a water quality emergency we will get in touch with our water customers through our phone dial notification system called **Swiftreach™**. The Water Department must maintain updated contact information. You may update your contact information by accessing the **Swiftreach™** icon on the Borough website homepage, by calling the Borough or directing an E-mail to erussell@borough.ambler.pa.us.




PA One Call System 8-1-1 — 'Call Before You Dig'



To assure safe digging for your project, dial 8-1-1 before you dig. Safe digging is no accident! If you are installing a fence or deck, or digging for a mailbox post, patio or other excavation project, it is important to Know What's Below. Make a Pennsylvania One Call phone call three to ten business days before your scheduled dig. PA One Call will notify utility companies who will mark where underground lines, cables and pipelines are located with colored paint, flags or chalk.

We are frequently asked what the colors mean. PA law follows the Common Ground Alliance Best Practices for Temporary Marking (ANSI standard Z535). White, proposed excavation; Pink, temporary survey markings; Red, electric power lines, cables, conduits and lighting cables; Yellow, gas, oil, steam, petroleum or gaseous materials; Orange, communication, alarm or signal lines, cables or conduits and traffic loops; Blue, potable water; Purple, reclaimed water, irrigation and slurry lines; and, Green, sanitary and storm sewer lines.

The Pennsylvania One Call service is no cost to homeowners. If you have a project where digging will occur on your own private property, call "811" or access PA One at www.pa811.org and submit your request online.

MARK YOUR ROLL CARTS

AMBLER'S PLANNING COMMISSION & THE PLANNING PROCESS

The Ambler Borough Planning Commission consists of nine residents appointed by Borough Council who serve for staggered terms of four years. These dedicated volunteers with various backgrounds and insight are tasked with the first step in the planning process as the starting point for most development and changes in the Borough.

The functions of the Planning Commission are to review subdivisions, land development plans, conditional use applications and lot line changes, assist in development of zoning and other Ordinance at the direction of Borough Council. The Planning Commission works toward providing for the coordinated development of the Borough and the general welfare of its people.

Because planning is a continuous process which shapes and guides the physical growth of the Borough in harmony with its social and economic needs, the Planning Commission urges all members of the public to attend its meetings and make known their views. Regular monthly meetings are held in Ambler Borough Meeting Hall, the fourth Tuesday of every month at 7:00 p.m. Special meetings and date changes will be announced and advertised as scheduled. Materials and agenda for the meeting are posted a day in advance of each meeting. All meeting minutes and agendas are posted on the Borough website under government-boards / committees – planning commission. Look forward to seeing you at the next Planning Commission meeting.

PROPERTY OWNER TIPS TO MAINTAIN AMBLER'S BEAUTY, WALKABILITY & CHARM

Walkability is one of the many cornerstones which makes Ambler a desirable place to live, work and play. Sidewalks exist on the majority of all streets within the Borough and those connections are a vital part to the Borough's pedestrian-oriented small-town environment. Walkable communities such as Ambler lead to both economic and natural benefits, more social interactions, and encourage physical fitness. Maintaining these resources is a community-wide effort. Property owners should be mindful and take notice of the following:

- > Inspect your sidewalks to make sure that any tripping hazards such as broken or raised sidewalks are repaired or replaced to avoid any possible injuries to pedestrians.
- > During the growing season, maintain any plants, flowers, or trees along sidewalk edges so that they do not hang low or inhibit pedestrians by cutting or trimming areas along curb lines where weeds or grass maybe become overgrown.
- > During winter months, shovel the snow off all sidewalks as soon as possible to avoid possible fines or pedestrian injuries. In addition, if there is a fire hydrant on your property be sure to clear a 3-foot radius around the hydrant and a clear path to the street.

Property owners are encouraged to work with their neighbors to maintain their sidewalks. If you see any of the above violations feel free to contact the Ambler Borough Code Department to investigate. Working together, we can all do our part to provide and maintain safe, clean, attractive, and walkable neighborhoods.

NOTES FROM THE TAX COLLECTOR

Jennifer Stomsky, Tax Collector

Hello Ambler residents! My name is Jennifer Stomsky and I am your new tax collector. I know that change sometimes comes with confusion, and there have been a lot of questions concerning the bills, so here are the things that you need to remember:

The County and Borough tax bills are mailed on March 1st.

- The discount (2%) period is from March 1st until April 30th.
- The face value period is from May 1st until June 30th.
- Bills paid after June 30th (until December 31st) will include a 10% penalty.

❖ The School tax bill is mailed on July 1st.

- The discount (2%) period is from July 1st until August 31st.
- The face value period is from September 1st until October 31st.
- Bills paid after June 30th (until December 31st) will include a 10% penalty.
- If you would like to pay your school bill using the three coupons that accompany it, you must pay the first coupon on or before July 31st. If you choose this option, please remember to pay the next two coupons on September 15th and October 31st, or you will be subject to a 10% penalty. Also, please keep in mind that you do not get the 2% discount with this option
- ❖ Interim taxes are collected all year. These are extra taxes assessed when you make renovations to your home.

I will collect taxes at Ambler Borough Hall on the first and third Tuesdays of each month, from 5:30-7:00 p.m. before the Council Meetings. For any other times, accommodations, or special needs, please call me at 215-367-5663 or email me at amblerborotaxcollector@gmail.com and I will be happy to set up a time and place that works for you. 

Ambler Square - DCNR Recreation & Conservation Grant

A DCNR Recreation & Conservation grant has been awarded to

Council Vice President Sara Hertz. Chair

Ambler Borough in the amount of \$102,000 for the development of **Ambler Square**, the 'pocket park' being planned on Butler Avenue near Park Avenue (at the location of the old 'ACME' sign). Work will include construction of a plaza, pedestrian walkway and stormwater management measures, ADA access, landscaping, project sign and other site improves. The grant was prepared with assistance from the Montgomery County Planning Commission. The name, Ambler Square, was the most popular name chosen in the survey conducted by our Parks & Rec Committee which was posted last year.

CDBG Grant - Removal of Architectural Barriers

Ambler Borough has received a Community Development Block Grant in the amount of \$70,425 for the removal of architectural barriers and reconfiguration and rehabilitation of the public area restrooms in the Gymnasium Wing of Ambler Borough Hall. The grant will enable the Borough to bring these facilities into conformance with current standards of accessibility.

Council Expands Park Hours of Operation

Ambler Borough has extended hours during which all Borough parks shall be open. Parks shall be open from sunrise until either 7:00 p.m. or sunset, whichever occurs later. Additionally, the Borough's Skate Park will be illuminated during the winter from twilight until 7:00 p.m. Persons are prohibited from being in the public parks when they are closed.

The Neighbor's Dog Barks Constantly! What Can I Do?



Summer is fast approaching and we know we all have pet peeves.

Even the most ardent dog lovers among us become aggravated if a neighbor's dog barks incessantly. The constant yapping can disrupt sleep, ruin your time in the yard and generally become an ongoing nuisance. But there are some steps you can take -- with effort and a little luck, you and the neighbor's dog can peacefully coexist.

For starters, don't blame the dog; he's being a dog. Several things could cause the barking:

- Some breeds are more territorial than others. Whether the dog is in the house or out in the yard, he may be "protecting" his home from passing cars, someone walking near his property, or just the mailman approaching the door.
- Dogs don't handle boredom well. If the dog is alone all day in the house or left alone in the yard for long periods of time, he may develop unwelcome compulsive habits, such as barking.
- If the dog sees or hears lots of activity outside, he may become excited enough to bark. This isn't necessarily a warning; it may be a way to express frustration at being left out of the fun or a stress reaction to the noise and activity.

So what can you do?

- 1. The first step is to talk to your neighbors. If they are away from the house all day, they may not even know about the barking. Or they may be aware of it and are already working on the problem. While it might be tempting to just drop a note in their mailbox, meet your neighbors face-to-face. Leave the attitude at home and communicate in a friendly, neighborly way that the barking is becoming a problem for you and your family. Don't assume, don't accuse; just explain the problem and give them a chance to respond. It's possible they're inexperienced dog owners.
- 2. You can be proactive, as well. If the dog barks every time you step into your yard or venture near his property, try blocking his vision by planting a hedge or erecting a fence or privacy screen. If the dog's barking is territorial, blocking his view of your property may remove the threat.
- 3. Of course, dogs don't just sense your presence visually. Mr. Barks-A-Lot next door can also hear or smell you. If blocking his view doesn't help, and he still perceives you as a threat, maybe it's time to make friends with him. Ask your neighbors if you and your family can meet their dog and let him get to know you. You might even suggest that the neighbors bring the dog over to your yard to play a bit. If your trips to the yard are rare, your occasional presence may startle or frighten the dog. Try

- making time outside an ordinary occurrence. Once he's used to the sight, sounds, and smells of his human neighbors, they may not be such a big deal to him, and he won't feel the need to bark.
- 4. So, you've done all the polite neighborly things you can to stop the annoying barking, and nothing's changed. You may have to resort to filing a formal noise complaint. Ambler Borough has a Noise ordinance 10-501 as well as a Dogs-not-to-be-permitted-to-continually-bark ordinance 2-203. It might be helpful to check with other neighbors to see if they're also affected by the barking. If so, ask them if they'll file similar complaints.
- 5. You can contact the police. Barking dogs are probably not high on their priority list, and you'll have to provide them with a written record of everything you've done so far. But they may issue a warning or citation to your neighbor.
- 6. Last, you can take more drastic steps when all else fails, including taking legal action by going to small claims court. Keep a record of the dates and duration of the barking, take video or audio clips on your mobile phone, and keep a record of all the steps you've taken so far. You might even consider hiring a lawyer to help you through the system.

Are you seeing a theme here? You cannot expect the dog to respect your wish for peace and quiet. But if you're willing to make an effort, and if you understand why the dog is barking so incessantly, you may be able to resolve all this with a friendly visit, some time spent with the dog, and at most, a few alterations to your yard. Or maybe a friendly smile and talk with your neighbor will solve the problem.
