## AMBLER BOROUGH PLANNING COMMISSION MINUTES OF FEBRUARY 27, 2024, MEETING

The Regular Meeting of the Ambler Borough Planning Commission was held on Tuesday, February 27, 2024, at 7:00 p.m. in Borough Council Chambers at 131 Rosemary Avenue, Ambler, Pennsylvania. Chairman John Oswald presided.

Input is requested on updating the 2013 Borough Comprehensive Plan. The Pennsylvania Municipalities Code suggests that each municipality review and/or update its Comprehensive Plan every ten years. The Borough's previous Plan was adopted in 2001 with a subsequent Plan update completed in 2013. The Comp Plan is a long-range planning document that outlines further growth and development for a municipality. Our County Planner, Timothy Konetchy, provided to the members at the January meeting a Preserve Enhance Transfer Brainstorming Exercise. Members completed the planning exercise giving comments concerning preserving features, enhancing features and transforming features. Tim then gathered members' comments on a poster board and will provide a summary of the comments to the commission for discussion at a future meeting to assist in updating the Comp Plan.
