AMBLER MAIN STREET CULTURAL AND ENTERTAINMENT INITIATIVES Ambler Borough


Ambler Main Street Cultural and Entertainment Initiatives received a 2007 Revitalization Award for the commitment and focused effort involved in renewing and enhancing Ambler's Main Street. These efforts have significantly contributed to the quality of life in Ambler and have helped to stimulate economic growth by bringing about the revitalization of existing businesses throughout the community and encouraging greater private sector investment in the area. The renewal and addition of cultural programs and entertainment venues, and the subsequent commercial investment in Ambler, have physically transformed Main Street into a unique and exciting central place for area residents to dine, shop, and participate in local community events.

Cultural and Entertainment Amenities

Many exceptional cultural and entertainment programs have been instituted or supported by Ambler Main Street, a nonprofit organization dedicated to making downtown Ambler a social, cultural, and business center for Ambler and surrounding areas. Ambler Main Street promotes Act II Playhouse and was instrumental in the redevelopment of the circa 1928 Ambler movie theater. reopened in February 2003. The organization also promotes and supports other cultural programs such as the Art in the Storefront initiative, an outdoor concert series featuring local school musicians, First Thursday events, an annual art show in the Artman Home, a ghost walking tour with the Wissahickon Historical Society, Oktoberfest, which features live music and dancing, and participation in The Big Read program with Montgomery County Community College.








Design Elements

The infusion of cultural and entertainment amenities along Main Street took place after careful consideration of the character of existing buildings. Ambler Main Street wisely built on the historic and pedestrian-friendly character of the area—one of the strengths along Butler Avenue. In many instances, the new enterprises renewed historic properties with architectural significance and promoted designs that would encourage pedestrian activity and social engagement while minimizing traffic. Local businesses were subsequently encouraged to apply their own unique storefront designs to enhance the pedestrian experience.









Process

Ambler Main Street, along with a network of devoted volunteers and partnerships with private sector investors, local and county governments, and private individuals, has successfully implemented, maintained, or supported many of the cultural and entertainment initiatives. The organization continues an endearing, integral connection with residents and visitors by building and maintaining a solid relationship with this diverse group of stakeholders.

Currently there are nine annual events that take place in the borough with the help of local government and over 100 volunteers. Volunteers lead and participate in the marketing, membership, business development, and fundraising efforts. The extensive volunteer program helps to create a sense of community while minimizing overall implementation costs.

The cultural and entertainment initiatives in Ambler Borough have been the catalyst for transformation along Main Street. Ambler's Main Street is a vibrant central place and popular destination in the region. An attractive streetscape and appealing, unique storefront designs provide residents and visitors with a pleasant experience while visiting the community's diverse restaurants and shops, theaters, and events.
